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# WHAT IS THE PEACE PLAN?

The PEACE Plan mobilizes ordinary people through a local church-to-church strategy. It's a decentralized approach to the five global giants that negatively impact our world. All the power and energy comes from the local church – initiated, continued, funded, and managed by pastors and their church members. PEACE Plan churches are the FRONTLINE solution to their communities.

The PEACE Plan works because it is **BY the church** and **THROUGH the church**.





# THE HISTORY OF PEACE

2003

The vision for The PEACE Plan is born when Pastor Rick visits a small South African church caring for 25 children orphaned by AIDS. God gave him a vision for local churches serving their communities in the ways Jesus did in his ministry on earth.

2005

The PEACE Plan is launched in Rwanda and led by a steering team of Rwandan church leaders. The first Purpose Driven network is initiated to unite all the churches there.

2008

Initial PEACE Projects: HIV/AIDS, Orphans & Vulnerable Children, Poverty Alleviation, Clean Water, Healthcare, Preschools, English as a Second Language – all including the Good News.

2004

His Excellency, President Paul Kagame, personally invites Pastor Rick and Kay Warren to help Rwanda become the first Purpose Driven Nation. Rwandan church leaders representing every denomination invite The PEACE Plan to begin in the country.

2006

Over 150 Saddleback members are sent to serve Rwandan local churches. Purpose Driven Church training begins with 2,219 pastors that graduated from the 3-year training program.

2012

23,000 Rwandans from every church network join together in unity to thank God at Rwanda Shima Imana, the first National Day of Thanksgiving initiated by the Rwanda PEACE Plan.



## 2014

Through the Rwanda PEACE Plan, the Musanze Declaration is agreed upon by all leaders of Rwandan churches. This implementation plan for resolution chronicles the commitment of church leaders to national healing, reconciliation, and unity.

## 2016

As a result of the success in Rwanda, the All-Africa Pastors Gathering begins with 20 African nations committed to implementing The PEACE Plan. Church leaders from Mexico, El Salvador, Colombia, India, Hong Kong, and the Philippines also decide to start nationwide PEACE Initiatives.

## 2019

All-Latin America is launched, starting in Costa Rica. Over 2,000 pastors and church leaders from 13 Latin American nations attend Pastor Rick's Costa Rica PEACE Plan event.

## 2015

The All-Africa Initiative is launched, led by Eric Munyemana. Over 32 African nations are represented at a 2014 launch event in Rwanda. In 2015 the Malawi PEACE Plan begins, led by Malawi church leaders and their international partner church, Parkview Church, led by Pastor Tim Harlow.

## 2017

Churches from the United States officially engage The PEACE Plan in 10 African nations. The Orphans & Vulnerable Children Initiative is nearing its "Getting to Zero" objective of seeing every child in an orphanage become part of a forever family in Rwanda. Just 2 orphanages remain in the nation.

## 2020

All 55 African nations are engaged in The PEACE Plan during the COVID-19 pandemic served by 35 International Partner Churches and Saddleback Church members equipped as "PEACE Digital Missionaries."

## 2022

The PEACE Plan's training expands to Asia, Eurasia, the Middle East, and North America. Global PEACE Relief responds to its 69th disaster since its inception in 2003 by sending funding and teams to the Ukrainian War refugee response in Ukraine, Poland, and Moldova.

# A NATIONWIDE MODEL FOR THE PEACE PLAN

From the small African nation of Rwanda, God is writing a new story through his Church. It's a story of hope and rebirth. It's a story that represents the seeds of a movement: a reformation in the modern missions era, positioning the local church to be a powerful force for good across the globe.

Seventeen years ago, Saddleback Church teamed up with local churches of all denominations in Rwanda to impact the country in a nationwide strategy called The PEACE Plan. This effort has established a historical collaboration, where all faith communities work alongside one another to restore a nation. Together, churches have paved the way for sustainable change that will continue to transform an entire nation for generations to come.

## PLANT CHURCHES THAT PROMOTE RECONCILIATION

The PEACE Plan recognizes that the local church is the most important change agent in the world and is the catalyst for communities to unite and address specific needs in their own communities, cities, and countries. Here's how local churches are implementing the various areas of The PEACE Plan - P.E.A.C.E. - in exponential ways in Rwanda, our first and most influential model nation.

The PEACE Plan began its church planting efforts in 2004 with a focus on Unengaged, Unreached People Groups (UUPGs).

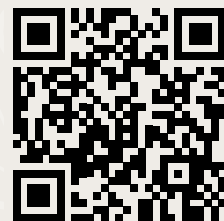
As the Purpose Driven movement grew, churches globally sought to plant new churches in their own communities and cities as well. This story is one such example:



### THE LETTERS OF PEACE COMING TOGETHER IN RWANDA TO CREATE CHANGE

#### PASTOR JOEL'S STORY

Pastor Joel Sengoga of Divine Destiny Church in Kigali, Rwanda, began planting his church in 2006 as Saddleback Church began sending PEACE teams to Rwanda. Over time more than 2,200 Saddleback Church members went on short-term trips to Rwanda to serve local churches and to mobilize their members to do every aspect of PEACE. Pastor Joel welcomed a PEACE team of college students, but wondered how students could really make a difference in addressing the five global giants. Surprisingly, God opened doors, “the lost and least of these” were served, and the church grew from 30 members to 400+ members that year. And while the lost were being saved and disciplined, poverty was being addressed, healthcare was introduced, and students were able to advance educationally through the holistic PEACE efforts of Divine Destiny Church.

# EQUIP SERVANT LEADERS

Equipping servant leaders has the potential to empower entire communities to act together rather than stand alone. It challenges leaders to share knowledge, training, insight, and hope that brings sustainable and lasting change.

Today, thousands of Rwandan churches are training leaders in government, business, and faith sectors. Top church leaders completed two-day leadership retreats on servant leadership. This joint effort between The PEACE Plan and the Rwanda Governance Board reaches every district to train over 1,000 church leaders in peace building, conflict resolution, and management principles.

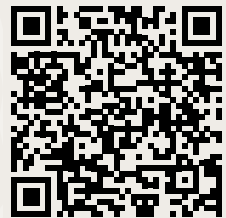
### REVIVING THE LOCAL CHURCH BY EQUIPPING SERVANT LEADERS

#### PASTOR JEAN'S STORY

Pastor Jean was commissioned to oversee a parish. His mission: Bring new life to a dying church. On the brink of closure, the church was suffering from poor attendance and lack of interest within the community.

As one of 200 selected Rwandan pastors, Jean took part in Purpose Driven Church training on how to build a healthy church using The PEACE Plan. He began implementing the strategies he learned and began sharing his new knowledge with the struggling church. "I put into practice what I had learned," he explains. "I started small groups, classes, activities in the community, and the 40 Days of Purpose campaign."

At the end of the campaign, transformation was almost instant. Attendance went from 30 members to 700. Giving increased from 40,000 Rwandan francs to 700,000. Baptisms rose from one person per year to 30 per month, in addition to the 407 people baptized at the end of the campaign. Soon after the successful growth in his church, the young pastor was transferred to another parish near the Ugandan border. He now knew from experience the pathway to building a healthy church with the Purpose Driven paradigm. Applying these same strategies, he began by training the elders and members before launching 40 Days of Purpose. In less than a month, 800 people were baptized. Attendance was so high they had to open a second parish. Pastor Jean says he has seen firsthand the benefits of building a healthy church and credits Purpose Driven for giving him tools to bring new life to communities. As one of 2,000 pastors who have received Purpose Driven Training, Pastor Jean is now one of 6 PEACE Plan Master Trainers in Rwanda. Pastor Jean adds, "When I see what God has done, I know that my life has allure and meaning."

## **ASSIST THE POOR**

The Bible commands us to speak on behalf of those who suffer. We assist the poor by empowering them with God’s vision of who they are and who they can be. The most effective way to assist those in need is through the caring community of a church family. The church not only equips; it nurtures and provides a place to belong and grow. The PEACE Plan mobilizes churches to offer opportunities, resources, and skills to help people better themselves and their families. As a result, thousands of families have come out of poverty, become self-sufficient, and begun to give back.

### **SMALL CHANGES BRING BIG BLESSINGS**

#### **CLEMENTINE’S STORY**

As a mother of seven children in Rwanda, Clementine Mukandori was a farmer, earning next to nothing to provide for her family. Despite her hard work, there was not enough money to pay for their basic household needs.

Through her church, Clementine learned of a credit and saving group. Created through the local church, saving groups teach people how to save money to start microbusinesses. Little by little she saved, starting out with 100 Rwandan francs and eventually saving 500—just enough to open an account.

With the funds she saved, Clementine requested a small loan to open her own restaurant. Her business took off, earning as much as 70,000 Rwandan francs per week.

Clementine was able to pay back her loan and earn interest on bigger savings. She even started investing in the dreams of others in her community. Today, the caring mother can easily pay for food, clothing, health insurance, and school fees. She looks back on her past struggles and is thankful for the opportunities the church offered her. She looks ahead to a secure future.

“This savings group has been so helpful to the life of my family,” says Clementine. “Now we can dress well and go to church feeling proud of what God has blessed us with. If it weren’t for the church and the savings group, I would still be among the poorest of the poor.”

### CARING FOR THE WHO, NOT THE HOW

#### BOVIC'S STORY

Pastor Straton and members of his local church minister to those infected with and affected by HIV/AIDS. He doesn't ask how they became infected—he just loves them by walking with them through their pain, holding their hands, and praying with them. Pastor Straton remembers the first time he met Bovic. Just months before, Bovic had lost his wife to HIV and was now raising their children alone. “The loss of my wife weighed heavy on my heart,” recalls Bovic. “I felt I had lost all hope.” A member in Pastor Straton's church invited Bovic and his children to attend church. He knew nothing about God's love and was skeptical of the invitation. Members welcomed him and his family with a supply of food, but their generosity didn't end there. In partnership with the government and clinics, Pastor Straton's church trained their members to help people living with HIV/AIDS – to share knowledge on preventative measures and provide medication to those in need. “My family and I were in a bad situation,” says Bovic. “We could have died at any time.” Through the church, Bovic and his children were tested for HIV/AIDS, and learned they were all positive. Bovic was afraid, but a church member told him that no matter what happens, God is in control. From that moment forward, Bovic and his kids began receiving HIV medication administered through the church. “Immediately I saw a big change in my life and in that of my children,” says Bovic. “When I look at the way we used to be, had we not taken this medication, we would not be alive today.” These acts of kindness have changed Bovic's perspective on God and the church.

## EDUCATE THE NEXT GENERATION

The Rwandan Orphan Care Initiative encourages families from the local church to adopt orphans. After eight years of successful partnership with the government, the program is now nearing its “getting to zero” goal of closing Rwandan orphanages. Today, only two orphanages remain open — focusing on physically handicapped children who require extra care in family placement.

Once children are adopted, their new families receive ongoing support and coaching on parenting using Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI). They are also trained to increase household income through savings groups and starting small businesses.

The Rwandan Orphan Sponsorship program is designed to financially support these families through the local church by providing a small stipend during an initial three-year start-up phase.

### LOVE OF A FAMILY

#### PASCASIE’S STORY



At just 35 years of age, Pascasie Mukampenda lost her husband and two children during the genocide. Feeling hopeless, Pascasie was left a widow with one child.

“After the genocide, it became emotionally difficult to go on with life,” she recalls. “I was not even able to support my daughter.”

In the midst of tragedy, her neighbor became pregnant and tried to abort the child. The abortion failed and the child was born with special needs. Unable to cope, the neighbor abandoned her child on Pascasie’s doorstep. Pascasie embraced the little girl as her own and turned to the local church to help her provide for her family. Members gave the young mother food, clothing, and training on how to support her family. Pascasie was humbled by their kindness, generosity, and willingness to accept her and her children. Without the church, Pascasie says she would never be where she is today.

Pascasie’s adopted daughter is eight years old and has made tremendous progress. “I thank God for my daughter because when I adopted her, I had no hope for the future and no help from anyone,” says Pascasie. “My family and I are cared for by the church. I’m so grateful for the significant difference in my life today.”



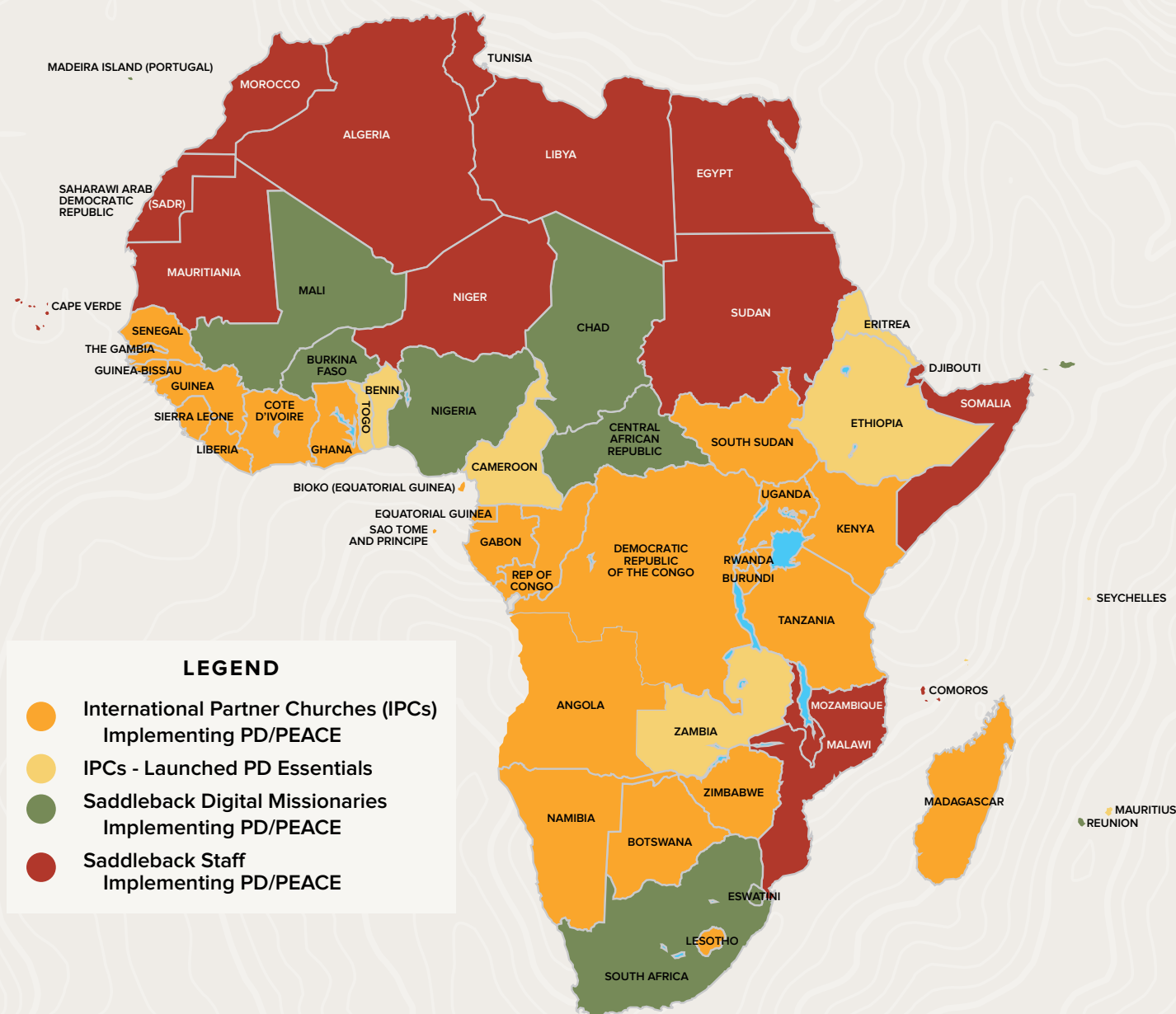
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# AFRICA

## ALL AFRICA INITIATIVE

The PEACE Plan’s success in Rwanda sparked international interest from other African countries to implement the same training and national strategies. The churches of Rwanda paved the way for a continent-wide movement that will continue to transform lives for generations to come.

The **All Africa Initiative** began in 2015, gathering local churches within African nations across denominations to share healthy church principles and best practices for serving their communities. International Partner Churches (IPCs) and Digital Missionaries have been paired with 55 national networks to cast a vision for church health and provide training in the Purpose Driven PEACE Plan models.



### MENTORSHIP AND COACHING - ONGOING RELATIONSHIPS

In addition to facilitating new relationships, the Online PEACE Training System allows for the continuation and strengthening of existing PEACE Trainings. Through ongoing coaching and mentorship relationships between IPCs and Digital Missionaries, the African Church leaders and members are now in training networks.

### ONLINE PEACE TRAINING AND DIGITAL MISSIONARIES

Nationwide Movements through PEACE partnerships and trainings initially occurred through short-term trips conducted by IPCs, church leaders, and members. When the global COVID-19 pandemic limited international travel, challenges that could have hampered the progress of the movement actually promoted a shift to training online.

The PEACE Plan online training system facilitated churches in Africa and their members to engage with training material in a variety of languages at their own pace. It also provided a foundation upon which digital missionaries - virtual PEACE Plan trainers - could coach leaders and members as they worked to implement new concepts. Leaders in each church could now access material at their own pace, refer back to sessions as needed, and onboard other church members in the appropriate language.

## COSTA RICA

# LATIN AMERICAN PEACE MODEL - COSTA RICA

Just like Rwanda in Africa, Costa Rica has become a small nation with powerful potential for PEACE.

“We looked for a nation that would be a base for this continent so that every other nation in Latin America can study,” said Pastor Rick at the time. “So we began to pray and talk with church leaders, and the Holy Spirit made it very clear that the base for this continent would be Costa Rica.”

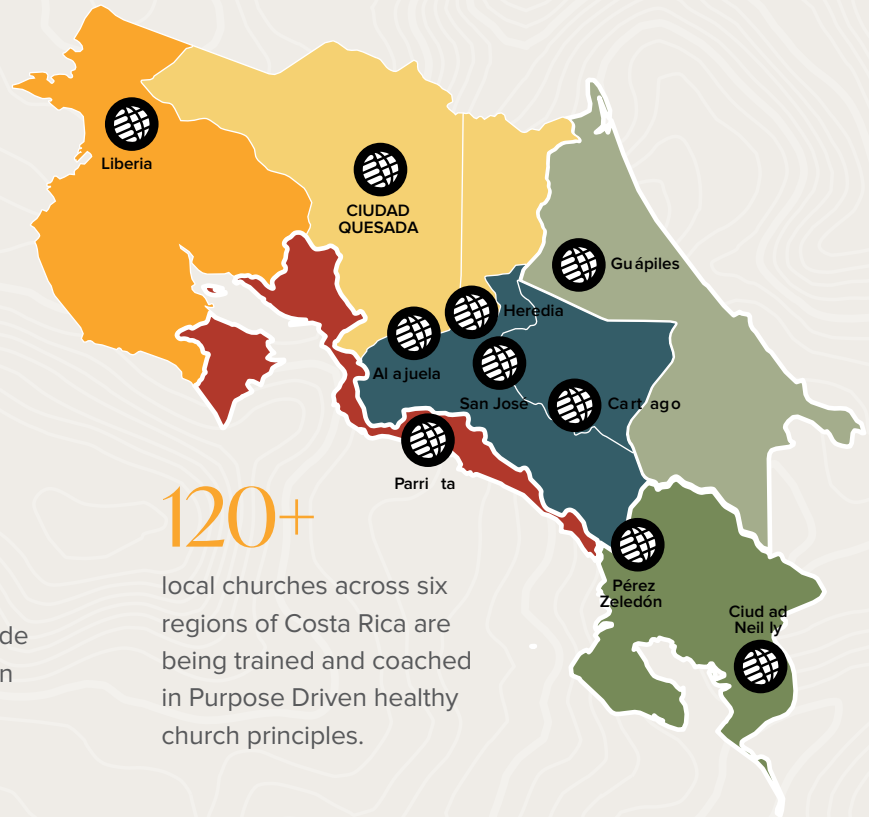
### TRAINING BEGINS ACROSS COSTA RICA

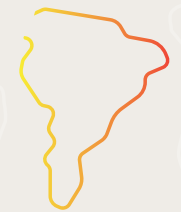
Utilizing the training they have received, our six regional PEACE Training Church hubs in Costa Rica are picking up the mantle to provide care for the hurting in their communities on an entirely new scale.

### PEACE TRAINING CHURCHES

Our six regional PEACE Training Church hubs comprise the National Leadership Team. They are utilizing in-depth training and implementation coaching they received from Saddleback Church digital missionaries. They have launched over 20 long-term community development projects including food distribution, English as a second language, poverty alleviation, business startup, Celebrate Recovery, and health care essentials.

**There are a total of 18 PEACE Training Churches in the six major regions of Costa Rica.**





# ALL LATIN AMERICA LAUNCHING THE PEACE PLAN IN ALL LATIN AMERICA

On August 9, 2019, over 2,000 pastors and church members from 13 Latin American countries came together in Costa Rica to partner with Saddleback Church for the official Latin American launch of The PEACE Plan. The training included 600 churches of all denominations from the following countries:

## MEXICO: A MOVEMENT ACCELERATES IN 5 STATES

Over the past seven years, The PEACE Plan has networked and trained over 1,800 pastors in Purpose Driven, concentrating especially in five states across Northern and Southern Mexico. The healthy church principles have proven so effective that two denominations—Assemblies of God and Nazarene—have implemented the paradigm as part of their denominational strategy for health and growth.

**Five churches across five Mexican states embarked on the PEACE Roadmap training and have launched 16 long-term community outreaches including planting over 100 house churches.**



# EQUIPPING THE GLOBE THROUGH REGIONAL PEACE HUBS

The PEACE Plan’s All Africa and All Latin Initiatives have become examples for the rest of the world. Now, every region is equipped with a PEACE Hub that serves within PEACE Training Churches for their nations and regions.

## “DIGITAL” MISSIONARIES TAKE TRAINING GLOBAL...WITHOUT GETTING ON A PLANE

Since 2004, churches around the world have been trained to implement The PEACE Plan. As they developed sustainable, reproducible, holistic “PEACE Works,” we scaled the training for churches around the world. For 10+ years, this was accomplished primarily through short-term teams from Saddleback Church. In that time, over 26,000 Saddleback members went to all 197 nations of the world!

In 2019, an online training system was designed to equip digital missionaries to develop PEACE Training churches as training bases for the major regions of the world. This digital model has proven to be highly effective over the past three years and continues to this day.



## ONLINE PEACE PLAN TRAINING SYSTEM

The PEACE Training System currently offers nine self-paced online distance learning courses with coaches assisting learners as they transform their churches to the PEACE model.

Courses are available in Spanish, Portuguese, French, Arabic, Kinyarwanda (Rwanda), Chinese, Russian, Hindi, and English.



# PEACE DISASTER RELIEF RESPONSES IN 2022

The PEACE Plan exists to equip local churches to create long-term change in communities by mobilizing their members. However, there are times when communities are hit with challenges so overwhelming that the global network of the body of Christ is called to help their brothers and sisters regain their footing. We call this PEACE Relief. Since the establishment of The PEACE Plan in 2003, we have come alongside local churches in the midst of 72 different global disasters.

## SERVING UKRAINIAN REFUGEES IN POLAND

The typical Ukrainian refugee is a woman 30 to 35 years old with one or two children. Sometimes she is with her mother, caring for both generations. Displaced into unfamiliar living conditions, she's suddenly lost home, occupation, and the security of extended family. Should she return home or remain safe in Poland? Her future is uncertain.

To address the plight of refugees, PEACE Relief has partnered with our network of churches in Poland to provide for basic needs like shelter, clothing, food, and medical supplies. Children are being assimilated into Polish schools and adults are connected to jobs. Saddleback Church has sent several trained Crisis Response Chaplains who are on the ground caring for the refugees' emotional and physical trauma. In all of this, local Polish churches are embracing Ukrainians with a unified effort to serve, sacrifice, and share the hope of the Good News.

## PRAYING PROTECTION OVER UKRAINE

Funds sent to Ukraine are distributed through networks of local churches. One pastor, Anatoly, located in Kyiv, Ukraine, sent our Saddleback Relief team an emotional video sharing testimonies of God's protection over the people of Ukraine. Pastor Anatoly's churches and network are serving displaced individuals across the nation and ask for your continued prayers.

## NIGER

Niger's severe drought brought famine followed by monsoon rains that left Nigerians without food or safe drinking water. The country is also facing bitter political civil unrest. PEACE relief efforts provided pipes for irrigation and seeds for replanting their fields.

Amid the environmental and political devastation, the farmers who are also pastors and church planters started a church planting movement with 15 new house churches in a hard-line Islamic country. Believers feel the blessing of God through our efforts and are encouraged in their faith.

# PEACE DISASTER RELIEF RESPONSES IN 2022 (CONTINUED)

## SRI LANKA

Sri Lanka is grappling with its most serious political and economic crises since 1948 and is on the brink of bankruptcy. Conditions are deplorable with daily power cuts that force hospitals to suspend surgeries. People are having to wait in line in the hot sun for hours to receive needed supplies. Saddleback PEACE Relief has provided basics like cooking oil, gas, essential food items, medicines, and generators.

Churches opened their doors to offer space to “work from church,” which provides shared desks and power supplies. Parents can work and have a place for their children to play and nap in the comfort of a fan. The results in “reaching the unreached” is phenomenal.



## BANGLADESH ROHINGYA REFUGEE CHURCH ENGAGEMENT & RELIEF PROJECT

The Rohingya genocide is a series of ongoing persecutions and killings of the Muslim Rohingya people by the Burmese military. The genocide has two phases: The first was a military crackdown that occurred from October 2016 to January 2017, and the second has been occurring since August 2017. Violence in Myanmar’s Northern Rakhine state forced over a million Rohingya to flee to other countries. Most fled to Bangladesh, resulting in the creation of the world’s largest refugee camp. Refugees are huddled in poor living conditions exacerbated by inclement weather. They are vulnerable to human trafficking, sexual and domestic violence, and disease outbreaks. Bony Baroi, a pastor in Bangladesh, serves these refugees and has been able to plant churches among them.

PEACE Relief assisted local churches in Bangladesh with:

- Counseling and pastoral care for 1,000 refugees
- Sharing gospel stories with 3,000 refugees in person and 7,000 by scripture audio
- Helping reunite families and bringing underserved families to the attention of local agencies for food distribution
- Connecting refugees with their relatives through video calls, building trust and a relationship with 200 families
- Praying in person with 3,000 people
- Distributing relief goods for 500 families
- Networking with 10 organizations to serve alongside for collective impact

Finishing The Task (FTT) is a momentous Great Commission global effort to complete four “B” goals by 2033. Established at the Billy Graham Amsterdam 2000 Conference, Pastor Rick Warren assumed the leadership of FTT in 2019 and continues to lead the FTT coalition globally.

In September 2022, Pastor Andy Wood became the new Senior Pastor of Saddleback Church, supporting a UUPG (Unengaged Unreached People Groups) initiative in harmony with the FTT Coalition.

TRANSLATED INTO EVERYONE’S HEART LANGUAGE AND DISTRIBUTED EVERYWHERE

There are approximately 2,002 languages that have no Bible translation, and 3,425 more where only portions of Scripture have been made accessible. Our goal is to see the start of Bible translation in each language by 2025, and the entire Bible translated into every language by 2033.
